State of Iowa Madison County SS: I, Eugene Wilson, of said County and State, first  
being <sup>duly</sup> sworn depose and say that I was well and personally acquainted with James J. Greer,  
who acquired title to the South Half ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ) of the North East Quarter ( $\frac{1}{4}$ ) of the North-  
west Quarter ( $\frac{1}{4}$ ) of Section Seven (7) in Township Seventy-four (74) North, of Range  
Twenty-nine (29) West of the 5th P.M., from Joseph H. Mack, and to my personal knowledge  
the said James J. Greer is the same person as J. J. Greer mentioned in an action for part-  
ition for said land, wherein F. M. Gibson et al were Plaintiffs and Cora Griswold et al  
were Defendants. And that at the time of the death of the said James J. Greer, he left  
surviving him Elizabeth Greer, his widow.

That the said Elizabeth Greer, widow of James J. Greer, died intestate and unmarried  
and left surviving her as her only heirs at law, her children who are the same persons  
as the heirs at law of James J. Greer, mentioned in said action for partition. That the  
death of Elizabeth Greer has been generally known to residents of the vicinity where  
said land is located for more than five year last past.

That she resided on said land until she became so infirm in age that she needed  
assistance in the care of herself and subsequently her daughter took her to her home  
in the State of Kansas and I assume that the survivor would have at all times claimed  
Madison County, Iowa as her home or place of residence.

She was the owner of a residence in Madison County, Iowa and no disposition was made  
of the residence property until after her death.

That I am now 48 years of age and that from the time of my birth until 1910, I resid-  
ed within a short distance of the home of James J. and Elizabeth Greer.

I further state that I was personally acquainted with John Greer who resided in  
Grand River Township, Madison County, Iowa, in 1891 and in the Town of Macksburg in said  
County in the years of 1903 and 1905 and from my personal knowledge, know that the said  
John Greer was not the same person as N. J. Greer, one of the heirs at law of James J.  
Greer, deceased, and that N. J. Greer's true name was Newton Jasper Greer.
