State of Iowa Madison County SS: I, Jacob L. Overhulser a resident of the County of Madison and State of Iowa, being first duly sworn upon my oath depose and say that I was well and personally acquainted with Christian Foglesong who on April 10th 1877 conveyed to Catherine Foglesong the S $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of 15-77-28, and of my own personal knowledge know that at the time of said conveyance the said Christian Foglesong and Catherine Foglesong were husband and wife. That the Charles Fogleson, to whom Samuel Cunningham deeded the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of 15-77-28 on December 2nd 1869, and the Charles Foglesong who together with his wife Elizabeth on December 29th 1871 conveyed the same land to Louisa B. Forrester, are one and the same person: the letter "g" having been left off his name in the deed from Cunningham.
