Wight who was one of the defendants in a certain action of partition in the Circuit Court of Madison County, Iowa, in which H. M. Wight was plaintiff and Ida May Wight and Cora E. Wight were defendants, and to whom was set off the $W\frac{1}{2}$ $NW\frac{1}{2}$ $NW\frac{1}{2}$ Sec. 16-75-29 as part of her distributive share of the real estate involved in said action; that the said Cora E. Wight subsequently intermarried with W. H. Duff, and was the same and identical person as the Cora E. Duff who joined in conveying the $W\frac{1}{2}$ $NW\frac{1}{2}$ $NW\frac{1}{2}$ of said Sec. 16-75-29 to Charles McIntyre on March 7th 1889 by deed recorded in Deed Record 27, page 249.

I further depose and say that I was acquainted with William McAferty who was one of the mortgagees in a certain mortgage executed by James McAferty and wife, dated April 23rd 1869 and recorded in Mortgage Record 1, page 420; that the said William McAferty died prior to the year 1898, unmarried and without issue, leaving as his sole and only heirs at law, his brothers and sisters, Mrs. Elisabeth Bunce, Mrs. Mary Mason, F. M. McAferty and James McAferty.
