That in the year 1887 I became acquainted with Eva Klingensmith, and that I knew her at all times thereafter until her death June 30th, 1917.

That Eva Klingensmith was in 1887, County Recorder of Madison County, Iowa, and that she at all times thereafter, until her death resided in Winterset, Iowa.

That subsequent to 1887 she united in marriage to W.P. Rhyno, and that during the time of their marriage she became owner and died seized of the following described real estate to-wit:-
