And now, Dec. 30, 1922. Application for Letters Testamentary filed. I, John B. Laidley, of Carmichaels, Greene County, Pennsylvania, being of sound mind and disposing memory, do hereby make, publish and declare this to be my last Will and Testament.

FIRST: I will and bequeath to my wife, the house and lot situate on Main Street, in the Borough of Carmichaels, Greene County, Pennsylvania, where we now reside, for and during the period of her life, or so long as she may desire to make said property her home; and at her death, or when she shall cease to make it her home, I direct that said property shall be sold at such time as my Executors, hereinafter named, shall deem it best to sell the same; and in case said property should be sold during the lifetime of my wife, I direct that the interest on the proceeds from the sale of said property, be paid to my wife during her life.

SECOND: I will and bequeath to my wife, the household goods and furnishings in the house where we now reside, together with the interest on one-third of my personal property, during her life; at her death I direct that all my personal property be disposed of and converted into the general fund of my estate. THIRD: All the residue of my estate, being the part not heretofore disposed of by me, I give, devise and bequeath to my three sons, William G. Laidley, Edmund W. Laidley and John G. Laidley, share and share alike. All advancements made by me to any of my sons to be charged against the share coming to said son, but no interest to be charged on any advancement. FOURTH: I hereby appoint my sons William G. Laidley,

Edmund W. Laidley and John G. Laidley, Executors of this my last will and testament, and hereby empower said Executors, or any two of them, to sell, execute and deliver deeds for any real estate of which I may die seized, at such times as they may deem proper, at either public or private sale.
