Whereas, On the 3rd day of April A.D., 1915, THE CONNECTICUT MUTUAL LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY, of Hartford, Connecticut, loaned to Francis A. Bonham and Pearl Bonham of Macksburg in the County of Madison and State of Iowa, Two Thousand Five Hundred and No/100 (\$2500.00) Dollars, to secure the repayment of which the said Francis A. Bonham and Pearl Bonham executed a note for said sum of money due and payable on the 3rd day of April A.D. 1920 at the office of The Connecticut Mutual Life Insurance Company, in the City of Hartford, and State of Connecticut, and further secured the repayment of such loan and note by a duly executed and acknowledged mortgage which is recorded in the Recorder's Office of Madison County, Iowa, in Book 61 of Mortgages page 95 and to which note and mortgage reference may be had, and upon which principal note there remains now due and unpaid the sum of Two Thousand Five Hundred and no/100 (\$2500.00) Dollars. And, Whereas, The said Francis A. Bonham and Pearl Bonham is now the legal owner of the premises described in said mortgage and has made application to the said The Connecticut Mutual Life Insurance Company to extend and postpone the time of payment of said unpaid sum for Five Years from April 3, A.D. 1925, said unpaid sum to bear interest at the rate of 5½ per centum per annum, payable annually on the 3rd day of April during the term of such extended payment, and until paid, according to five interest notes signed by them and have further agreed, and do hereby agree, to well and truly and promptly pay to the said The Connecticut Mutual Life Insurance Company in five years from April 3rd A.D. 1925 said unpaid principal sum and interest notes as they mature, and to observe, fulfil, keep and perform all and singular the other covenants and agreements on their part in said mortgage contained and agreed to be kept and performed according to the true intent and meaning thereof. The said Francis A. Bonham and Pearl Bonham further agree to pay, before the same shall become delinquent, all taxes and assessments of any kind that may be laid within the State of

Iowa upon the premises or any part thereof, covered by said mortgage, or upon the interest of the said The Connecticut Mutual Life Insurance Company, its successors or assigns, in said premises, or upon the notes or debt secured by said mortgage.

And, Whereas, Pearl Bonham wife of said Francis A. Bonham joins herein and consents to this extension;

Now, Therefore, The said The Connecticut Mutual Life Insurance Company, in consideration of the covenants and agreements on the part of the said Francis A. Bonham and Pearl Bonham hereinbefore contained, the prompt and faithful performance whereof is a condition precedent, and time being of the essence of this contract, hereby agrees to extend and postpone the time of payment of said note until the 3rd day of April A.D. 1930 subject, however, to the privilege of making prepayments at any time in multiples of \$100, as in said note provided; and in the event of neglect or refusal by the said Francis A. Bonham and Pearl Bonham to pay promptly during such extended term the interest payments as they severally become due, and the principal sum upon the expiration of such extended term, or to keep and perform all the covenants and agreements contained in said mortgage and in this extension agreement, then this agreement shall be null and void, and said principal note, as well as all overdue and accrued interest, or any other indebtedness owing under the provisions of this mortgage shall at once become due and payable, and the said The Connecticut Mutual Life Insurance Company shall have full power and authority to proceed under and by virtue of said note and mortgage in as full and ample a manner as if this agreement^{had} not been made. Nothing herein shall be construed to release or discharge the said Francis A. Bonham and Pearl Bonham from liability upon said note or mortgage, this instrument being taken as collateral and additional security thereto.
