Under the provisions of an act approved May 1, 1926, the rates of pension heretofore pay-
able to widows, former widows, minor children, and helpless children, under the Act of
September 1, 1922, have been increased as follows:

From \$20 per month to \$30 per month; and for each minor child under 16 years of age, or
helpless child, the additional rate is increased from \$4 per month to \$6 per month.

Payment at these increased rates, which commence June 4, 1926, will be made in the
pension checks dated July 4, 1926. Application for this increase of pension is not
