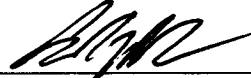
The undersigned, the duly appointed and acting City Administrator of the City of Winterset, Iowa, does hereby certify that the City Council of the City of Winterset, Iowa did enact and take the following described actions with respect to adopting the amended Zoning and Subdivision Ordinances for the City of Winterset:

1. On July 28, 2026, the Winterset Planning & Zoning Commission approved this Zone Change Request and recommended such land use change to the City Council.
2. On August 3, 2026, the City Council approved resolution number 2026-35 to set a date of public hearing reclassifying land use from the C-Commercial to I-Industrial Zoning District.
3. On August 5, 2026, the City published notice and informed property owners within 200' of the rezone request of the public hearing as required by the City Zoning Ordinance.
4. On August 17, 2026, the City Council conducted a public hearing on the proposed reclassification of land use.
5. On August 17, 2026, the City Council approved Resolution 2026-35 for the Application and Rezoning Petition and the first reading of Ordinance #675. The City Council approved the waiving of the second and third reading of Ordinance #675. The final reading and adoption of Ordinance #675 was adopted and passed by the City Council of Winterset on August 17, 2026.
6. On August 19, 2026, Ordinance #675 was published in the Winterset Madisonian, said publication included the entire legal description of text of the amended Zoning

and Subdivision regulations and included a copy of the amended, revised and updated Zoning District map, a copy of the Affidavit of Publication is attached hereto.

Vicious Dog Determination Appeal

Mayor Leners introduced prior events and his determination of the dog to be vicious. Mr. Fogg presented items to council. Mayor Leners remarked the dog, appeared to be a pitbull based on photographic evidence.

Mr. Fogg presented a dog license issued by the City of Winterset, a veterinarian temperament attestation, a vaccination report and remarked all breeds were documented to be Rottweiler/Lab mix. Continued discussion relative to the hearing based solely on appearance with the absence of a bite, a victim, objective DNA. WHEREAS food truck permits shall be suspended per (Title II, Chapter 1, Section 2.114, Section 2) so long as the special event committee (organizer) "the committee files with the City Administrator a list of peddlers and/or transient merchants and the item or items of goods and/or services being sold by each vendor during the special event" and shall comply with Title II, Chapter 1, Section 2.114; and,

WHEREAS, a portion of the fireworks ordinance shall be suspended on September 19th, 2026, from the hours of 6 p.m. to 11:59 p.m. (Title III, Chapter 14 Sections 3.1403 (E), all other sections are withstanding and in effect as well as a consultation with the Fire Chief, and proof of insurance prior to the event.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Winterset, Iowa that the Community event shall be authorized so long as the specific criteria and requirements are met as documented in this resolution for the above-mentioned date and times.

RESOLUTION TO SUPPORT A COMMUNITY EVENT

WHEREAS, Tobi Greene with Remax Realty wishes to support a chili cook off on September 19th, 2026; and

WHEREAS, the organizer desires to host alcohol consumption and requests a temporary street closure; and,

WHEREAS, the consumption of alcohol would be prohibited by Winterset Code, Title III Health, Safety, Welfare, Chapter 3.4, Misdemeanor, Section 3.404 a.; and,

WHEREAS, the State of Iowa Alcohol Beverage Division (ABD) was consulted and confirmed that legal aged consumption was allowed on throughfares when closed and liquor licenses for existing businesses would not need to be amended, and the consumption of alcohol on public spaces is controlled by local ordinance and sale is controlled by ABD licenses approved at the local level; and,

WHEREAS, Title II, Chapter 1, Section 2.101 requires permits for transient merchants and peddlers, however provides exemption according to section, 2.103 "EXEMPTIONS Farmers or gardeners selling their produce, newspaper carriers, students engaged in activities authorized or sponsored by their school, religious, charitable, and nonprofit organizations shall be excluded from the application of this chapter"; and,

WHEREAS, a temporary street closure of E Jefferson St from John Wayne Drive East to 2nd Street; and,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Winterset, Iowa that the street shall be temporarily closed and the following ordinances shall be suspended; Ordinance Title III Health, Safety, Welfare, Chapter 3.4, Misdemeanor, Section 3.404 a. and Title II, Chapter 1, Section 2.101 for the period of September 19th, 2026, from the hours of 7:00 am to 5:00 p.m. The limits of this Ordinance suspension only applies to the cordoned area of the city streets marked by barriers, the temporary closure of roads, and for the above mentioned date and times.

SPECIAL STOP SIGNS OF CHAPTER 4 OF TITLE VI OF THE WINTERSET MUNICIPAL
CODE

WHEREAS, the City of Winterset has reviewed traffic control measures at the intersection of North 16th Avenue and West Jefferson Street; and,

WHEREAS, West Jefferson Street is designated as a through street pursuant to Title VI, Chapter 4, Section 6.408 of the Winterset Municipal Code; and,

WHEREAS, Section 6.409 of the Winterset Municipal Code provides for the placement and maintenance of stop or yield signs on non-through streets intersecting through streets; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council finds it appropriate and necessary for the regulation and safety of traffic to require northbound and southbound traffic on North 16th Avenue to stop at its intersection with West Jefferson Street;

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the City Council of Winterset, Iowa, as follows:

SECTION 1. ADDITION.

Section 6.411 "Special Stop Signs" of the Winterset Municipal Code be and is hereby amended to add the following new subsections thereto as follows:

(w) North 16th Avenue and West Jefferson Street at the intersection controlling the northbound and southbound traffic on North 16th Avenue.

SECTION 2 ENFORCEMENT. A person who violates this Ordinance shall upon conviction be guilty of a simple misdemeanor punishable as provided by law.

SECTION 3. PENALTY. Any violation of this Ordinance, or any provision thereof, shall be a municipal infraction subject to the provisions of Iowa Code Section 364.22 more specifically, Winterset Municipal Code 6.321.322, as amended.

SECTION 4. SEVERABILITY. If any portion of this Ordinance shall be held unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, this decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance not so declared unconstitutional or invalid.

SECTION 5. RECORDING. This Ordinance shall be included with and be part of the Winterset Municipal Code, as now amended.

SECTION 6. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance # 676 shall be in effect from and after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law. Thereafter, this Ordinance shall be included with and be part of the Winterset Municipal Code, as now amended.

RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING A HOUSING STEERING COMMITTEE TO SUPPORT THE RURAL HOUSING READINESS ASSESSMENT INITIATIVE

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Winterset, Iowa recognizes that the availability of housing is a central community concern and aims to demonstrate municipal support for creating new housing opportunities to address long-term community needs; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to apply for the Empower Rural Iowa Rural Housing Readiness Assessment (RHRA) Grant, funded by the Iowa Economic Development Authority (IEDA), which, if awarded, would provide for a contract with Iowa State University Extension and Outreach Community and Economic Development (CED) to conduct the Rural Housing Readiness Assessment; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to engage the community and involve a diverse group of community members and formally establish an advisory committee of volunteer community members to assist in assessing community housing needs, developing recommendations, and providing advice to the City Council;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Winterset, Iowa as follows:

1. The City Council hereby establishes a committee, referred to hereinafter as the Housing Steering Committee, to guide the work of the Rural Housing Readiness Assessment (RHRA) program, contingent upon the City's receipt of the Empower Rural Iowa RHRA Grant and the resulting contract with Iowa State University, and to participate in the assessment phase and the development of recommendations to be made to the City Council. The committee shall be voluntary, consist of members of the community who either live or work within the boundary or near the boundary of the City of Winterset, and include City Elected Officials, City Staff, Housing Industry Representatives, Nonprofit Organization Representatives with a housing mission, Major Employer Representatives, and Community Members with an interest in housing.
2. Upon award of the grant and initiation of the contract with Iowa State University, the Housing Steering Committee shall work with Iowa State University Extension and Outreach Community and Economic Development (CED) Specialists over a period of six

(6) to nine (9) months, and shall complete its work and report its recommendations to the City Council no later than March 20th, 2028.

3. This resolution is effective immediately upon enactment by the City Council.

RESOLUTION COMMITTING LOCAL MATCHING FUNDS IN SUPPORT OF THE CITY OF WINTERSET'S APPLICATION FOR THE EMPOWER RURAL IOWA RURAL HOUSING READINESS ASSESSMENT (RHRA) GRANT

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Winterset, Iowa recognizes that the availability of housing is a central community concern and aims to demonstrate municipal support for creating new housing opportunities to address long-term community needs; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to apply for the Empower Rural Iowa Rural Housing Readiness Assessment (RHRA) Grant, funded by the Iowa Economic Development Authority (IEDA), which, if awarded, would provide for a contract with Iowa State University Extension and Outreach Community and Economic Development (CED) to conduct the Rural Housing Readiness Assessment; and

WHEREAS, the application requirements for the Empower Rural Iowa RHRA Grant include documentation of a committed local funding match to demonstrate the community's investment in the assessment process; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that a commitment of local funds in the amount of \$10,000.00 is available and appropriate to serve as the City's local match toward the RHRA Grant application and the resulting contract with Iowa State University; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds it is in the best interest of the City of Winterset to formally commit these funds to secure and support the assessment process should the grant be awarded;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Winterset, Iowa as follows:

1. The City Council hereby commits local funding in the amount of \$10,000.00 to serve as the City's local match in support of the Empower Rural Iowa Rural Housing Readiness Assessment (RHRA) Grant application, said funds to be designated from the City's Economic Development Funds.
2. This commitment of funds is contingent upon the City's receipt of the RHRA Grant award and shall be applied toward the resulting contract with Iowa State University Extension and Outreach Community and Economic Development (CED) for completion of the Rural Housing Readiness Assessment.
3. The Mayor and City Administrator are hereby authorized and directed to sign any forms or documentation required to evidence this funding commitment as part of the City's RHRA Grant application, upon approval of the same by the City Attorney.

RESOLUTION NO. 2026-41

A RESOLUTION MODIFYING TIMELINE FOR FINANCING AND CONSTRUCTION OF WINTERSET FIELDHOUSE AND POLICE STATION

WHEREAS, in 2021 the Winterset Parks and Recreation Board commissioned ETC Institute to complete a Needs Assessment to assist in determining the priorities of the community relative to parks, recreation and trails. Such Needs Assessment produced statistically valid results showing the priorities of Winterset residents to be indoor health and wellness opportunities and community indoor gathering spaces.

WHEREAS, in 2022 the City of Winterset (hereinafter “City”) partnered with Confluence to complete a City Comprehensive Plan and a Parks, Recreation and Trails Master Plan. The completion of these Plans included significant public input and engagement, all of which highlighted the overwhelming desire and need to plan and construct an “indoor community center” to include sports courts, space for seniors to exercise and socialize, and space for wellness and fitness programs.

WHEREAS, in 2022 in keeping with the needs and wishes of the residents of Winterset, as demonstrated by the Needs Assessment and the Parks, Recreation and Trails Master Plan, the City sought to create a Business Plan to outline and understand the cost of constructing an indoor recreational facility and achieving the outcomes defined by the community. The Business Plan was presented to the community at two separate public meetings in early 2024.

WHEREAS, during 2024 and 2025 the City embarked upon the design and engineering phase of what would become known as the Winterset Fieldhouse. During this process, it was determined that the City also would benefit from including a new Winterset Police Station as part of the building project.

WHEREAS, the Winterset City Council scheduled a public hearing for April 6, 2026, at 7:00 p.m. on the matter of the proposal to enter into a General Obligation Urban Renewal Loan Agreement (hereinafter “Loan Agreement”) pursuant to the provisions of Iowa Code 384.24A to borrow the funding necessary to construct the Winterset Fieldhouse and Police Station;

WHEREAS, prior to the scheduled public hearing the City received a timely submitted petition from eligible electors requesting an election with respect to the Loan Agreement. Upon consideration of such petition the City deemed it advisable to call an election upon the proposal to enter into such Loan Agreement and issue its bonds and borrow money thereunder.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Iowa Code Section 47.6 the City must provide written notice to the Madison County Commissioner of Elections no later than August 19, 2026, that the matter of the Loan Agreement will be placed on the ballot for the November 3, 2026, election

WHEREAS, Iowa Senate File 2472 was passed by the Iowa Legislature during the 2026 legislative session and signed by the Governor on May 18, 2026. Iowa Senate File 2472 affects every major component of the property tax system, including levy limits, homestead relief, assessment classifications, urban renewal, and local government budgeting and finance practices. Accordingly, Senate File 2472 will have a major impact on the City’s operating budget starting with fiscal year 2027-2028.

WHEREAS, until the City has had the opportunity to better understand the impact of Senate File 2472 on its overall budget and make appropriate and necessary adjustments required by the new property tax legislation, the City deems it prudent and advisable to delay moving forward with Loan Agreement for the financing of the Winterset Fieldhouse and Police Station.

WHEREAS, the City postponing action on the Loan Agreement alleviates the necessity of the proposed Loan Agreement for the financing of the Winterset Fieldhouse and Police Station being submitted to the voters on the November 3, 2026, election ballot.

IT IS THEREFORE RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Winterset, Iowa, as follows:

Section 1. The City of Winterset shall not move forward with the proposal to enter into a General Obligation Loan Agreement pursuant to Iowa Code Section 384.24A to borrow money for the purpose of construction of the Winterset Fieldhouse and Police Station, as was previously authorized by the Council on March 2, 2026.

Section 2. The Winterset City Clerk need not notify the Madison County Commissioner of Elections to place the matter of the proposed General Obligation Loan Agreement on the ballot for the November 3, 2026, general election as was previously directed by the Council on May 18, 2026.

Section 3. All resolutions of parts of resolutions in conflict herewith are hereby repealed, to the extent of any such conflict.

ORDINANCE RECLASSIFYING LAND USE FROM THE C-COMMERCIAL TO I-INDUSTRIAL ZONING DISTRICT

WHEREAS, Covered Bridges Coffee Company petitioned the City Planning & Zoning Commission to reclassify land from the C-Commercial Zoning Classification to the I-Industrial Zoning Classification; and

WHEREAS the Planning & Zoning Commission duly approved this request for a zone change on July 28, 2026 and recommended such land use change to the City Council; and

Section 3. The Mayor and City Administrator be and are hereby authorized to enter this zoning district change on the official zoning map of the City of Winterset, Iowa as provided by Section 4.12098 of the Winterset Municipal Code.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

Section 5. If any portion of this Ordinance shall be held unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, this decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance not so declared unconstitutional or invalid.

Section 6. This Ordinance shall be included with and be part of the Winterset Municipal Code.

Section 7. A person who violates this Ordinance shall upon conviction be guilty of a simple misdemeanor punishable as provided by law.

Section 8. A person who violates this Ordinance shall be deemed to have committed a Municipal Infraction punishable upon conviction as provided by Iowa Code Section 364.22, as amended.
