I regret very much to call your attention to this matter, but since I am now expergencing a considerable less, and disapointment, with my livestock because of the fact that their fence was not built and repaired as directed by your Board in a reasonable time, I have decided to let the Wilsons look after their own fence.

I realize the Board has tried to get the Wilson's to do their duty, also that it has been a very aggravating case, but I still insist that the fence must be fixed,

ORDER OF TRUSTEES ON DIVISION OF PARTITION
 FENCE BETWEEN FRANK AND OLIVE WILSON AND
 ARTHUR MARKS

The Board of Township Trustees of Penn Township, Madison County, Iowa, all members present, met on the premises owned by Frank and Olive Wilson and Arthur Marks in Section Thirteen (13) of Penn Township, Madison County, Iowa, on December 15, 1947, at 9:00 o'clock A. M., and there being present at said time and place Frank Wilson and Arthur Marks, owners of the respective tracts of land involved, and the Board of Township Trustees acting as fence-viewers under the provisions of Chapter 113 of the 1946 Code of Iowa, and after hearing the statements of all parties present, and after viewing the Partition Fence in question, hereby make the following division of said Partition Fence.

To Arthur Marks--that part of the North-South Partition Fence located between the Northwest Quarter (NW $\frac{1}{4}$) of the North-east Quarter (NE $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section Thirteen (13) and the Northeast Quarter (NE $\frac{1}{4}$) of the Northwest Quarter (NW $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section Thirteen (13), all in Township Seventy-seven (77), North, Range Twenty-nine (29) West of the 5th P. M., Madison County, Iowa, commencing at the North end thereof from a Corner Post supposed to be Thirty (30) feet from the center of the road: thence South (S) for a

distance of $775\frac{1}{2}$ feet or Forty-seven (47) rods.

To Frank and Olive Wilson--that part of said North-South Partition Fence described above, commencing at a point $775\frac{1}{2}$ feet from the North end thereof and running thence South (S) for a distance of $500\frac{1}{2}$ feet, or to the South end of said Partition Fence, including the water gap contained in said part of said fence.

It is further ordered by the undersigned fence-viewers that each of said owners shall immediately make said Partition Fence awarded to each of them a lawful fence and upon either of said parties making and erecting a tight fence, then the other party shall do so.

The costs of the proceedings for the division of said fence in the total sum of \$25.00 will hereby be assessed, one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) to Arthur Marks and one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) to Frank and Olive Wilson.

All of which is ordered and entered of record.
