and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant unto the said

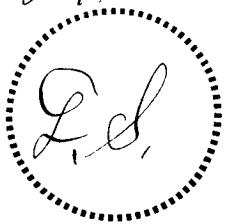
John Morris and to his heirs the said tract above described;
