according to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled, "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for the South West quarter of the North East quarter of Section Seven in Township Seventy four, North of Range Twenty seven, West in the District of Lands subject to sale at Chariton Iowa containing Forty acres.

According to the official plat of the survey of the said lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said Joseph Reager

Joseph Reager and to his heirs the said tract above described; to have and to hold the same together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatever nature, thereunto belonging unto the said Joseph Reager and to his heirs and assigns forever.
