Certificate No. 1506,

Whereas, William Forster of Madison County, Iowa, ha S deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Fort Des Moines whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said William Forster,

according to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled, "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for the South half of the South West quarter of Section Eleven in Township Seventy-seven North, of Range Twenty-eight West in the District of Lands Subject to sale at Fort Des Moines, Iowa, Containing Eighty Acres.

According to the official plat of the survey of the said lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract ha S been purchased by the said William Forster

Now know ye, that the United States of America, in consideration of the premises and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant unto the said William Forster and to his heirs the said tract above described; to have and to hold the same together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatever nature, thereunto belonging unto the said William Forster and to his heirs and assigns forever.
