Whereas, Samuel S. Lungren of Washington County, Maryland has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Fort Des Moines whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Samuel S. Lungren

according to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled, "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for the West fractional half of the North West quarter of Section Two, in Township Seventy-six, North of Range Twenty-six West in the District of Lands subject to sale at Fort Des Moines Iowa, containing Eighty-six Acres and Eighty-two hundredths of an Acre.

According to the official plat of the survey of the said lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said Samuel S. Lungren

Now know ye, that the United States of America, in consideration of the premises and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant unto the said

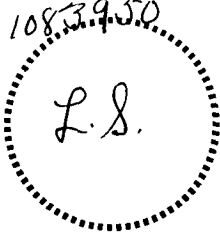
