Smith and to his heirs the said tract above described;

to have and to hold the same together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatever nature, thereunto belonging unto the said James J. Smith and to his heirs and assigns forever.

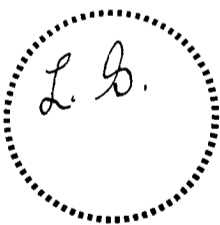
