Joseph B. Pounds and to his heirs, the said tract above described. To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging, unto the said Joseph B. Pounds and to his heirs and assigns forever.

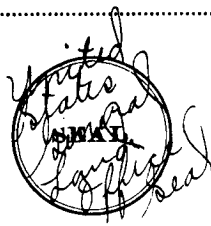
