To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting: Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved March 22d, 1852, entitled "An Act to make Bounty Land Warrants assignable, and for other purposes," Warrant No. 767 for 160 acres, issued in favor of Frances M. Hainsen, Private in Captain Grumbles Company Texas Militia, Indian War has been returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the North West quarter of Section ten in Township Seventy seven North of Range Twenty seven West, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Fort Des Moines Iowa containing one hundred and sixty acres according to the Official Plat of the Survey of said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL: Which has been assigned to WILLIAM P. Heath

NOW KNOW YE, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said William P. Heath the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said William P. Heath and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, I, Franklin Pierce PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
