THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA:

To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, By the Act of Congress approved June 2, 1858, providing for the location of certain confirmed private land claims in the State of Missouri, and for other purposes, it is declared that in all cases of confirmation by this act, or where any private land claim has been confirmed by Congress, and the same in whole or in part, has not been located or satisfied or for any reason whatsoever other than a discovery of fraud in such claims subsequent to such confirmation either for want of a specific location prior to such confirmation, it shall be the duty of the Surveyor General of the district in which such claim was situated, upon satisfactory proof that such claim has been so confirmed, and that the same, in whole or in part, remains unsatisfied, to issue to the claimant or his legal representatives, a certificate of location for a quantity of land equal to that so confirmed and unsatisfied, which certificate may be located upon any of the public lands of the United States subject to sale at private entry, at a price not exceeding one dollar and twenty-five cents per acre. Provided, That such location shall conform to legal divisions and sub-divisions, and whereas, it appears that the Surveyor General of Illinois and Missouri has issued his certificate, No. 229, for seventeen thousand and thirteen acres and eighty-nine hundredths of an acre, in satisfaction for the claim of John Baptiste Valle, entered as number three hundred and thirty-four (first class, but excepted in the confirmatory Act of July 4, 1838) in the report dated November 27, 1833, of the Board of Commissions under the Act of Congress of July 9, 1832, and March 2, 1833, and confirmed by the first section of the aforesaid Act. of Congress of June 2, 1858, and it appearing from certificate No. 20993 of the Register of the Land Office at Fort Des Moines, Iowa, which has been deposited in the General Land Office, that in virtue of said certificate No 229 of the Surveyor General aforesaid, there have been located the following described tracts of land, being in satisfaction of the aforesaid claims of John Baptiste Valle to-wit:- the southwest quarter of the southeast quarter of section six, the northeast quarter of the southwest quarter of section eight, the northeast quarter of the southwest quarter of section ten, the southeast quarter of the southeast quarter of section twenty, the northeast quarter of the southeast quarter of section twenty two, and the northwest quarter of the northwest quarter of section thirty six in township seventy four north, of range twenty seven west, according to the official plat of the survey of the said land returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General.

Now Know Ye, That the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and pursuant to the provisions of the Act of Congress aforesaid of June 2, 1858, Have Given and Granted, and by these presents Do Give and Grant unto the said John Baptiste Valle, or his legal representatives, the tracts of land above described. To Have and To Hold the said tracts with the appurtenances, unto the said John Baptiste Valle, or his legal representatives, and to

his or their heirs *and* assigns forever.

In Testimony Whereof, I, Ulysses S. Grant, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed. Given under my hand at the City of Washington, the fifteenth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy and of the Independence of the United States the ninety fourth.
