WHEREAS, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved March 22d, 1852, entitled "An Act to make Bounty Land Warrants assignable, and for other purposes," Warrant No. 3330 for 40 acres, issued in favor of Daniel Foss, Ensign in Captain Preals Company Maine Militia, Arastook War has returned to the General Land Office, with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the

North East fractional quarter of the North West quarter of Section Eighteen in Township Seventy four of Range twenty six, in the District of Lands, Subject to sale at Chariton, Iowa containing thirty *five* acres and twenty six hundredths of an acre according to the Official Plat of the Survey of said Lands returned to the General Land Office, by the Surveyor General: Which has been assigned to Edward M. Greenway Junior.

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said Edward Greenway Junior the tract of Land above described: To Have and To Hold the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Edward M. Greenway Junior and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony Whereof, I Franklin Pierce President of the United States of America, have caused these Letters to be made Patent and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed/.
